### The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation The Steps of the Sacrament

The sacrament of penance and reconciliation can be celebrated individually or in a communal service. Both rites include individual confession and absolution. Contrition

We prepare for the sacrament through an examination of conscience, reflecting on our lives and the choices we've made. We may use the Ten Commandments and teachings of Jesus to guide our examination. We reflect on how generous-or selfishour responses to God and others have been

To be forgiven, we must show contrition, sorrow for our sins, and be resolved to follow Jesus' command to the woman caught in adultery, "from now on do not sin any more" (John8:11).

### **Confessing Sins, Accepting a Penance**

We admit our sinfulness and confess our sins. Perhaps a Scrip-

ture passage made us aware of an area in which we haven't loved enough. Father, I'm like the older son in the gospel you read, and I'm not ready to forgive others." Or, "I have sinned and I desire absolution."

The priest will assign penance. The act of penance-often a prayer, Scripture reading, or action-helps heal us of the sin and, in some way, makes up for the damage our sin caused.



## January 28th, 2023 Fourth Week in Ordinary Time DT 18:15-20; PS 95:1-2, 6-7, 7-9; 1 COR 7:32-35; MK 1:21-28



Our readings today remind us of God's authority.

As we reflect on our Gospel, we recognize that God possesses all authority and that we want to give Him all authority. Jesus was teaching in the synagogue on the Sabbath. All were fixed on His words and astonished at what He had to say. Suddenly everyone's

attention shifted to a man with an unclean spirit who began to question Jesus and His authority. Jesus responded, "Quiet, come out of him!" and removed the evil spirit from the man. All were amazed at the healing of this man.

Life can sometimes look like the synagogue in Capernaum. We are living as disciples of Christ when we suddenly recognize evil around us — through events in our lives, temptations we are enduring, or by falling into sin. It can distract us, consume our attention, or even cause us to despair. In these moments of trial, we must remember the Healer in our Gospel today. Recall His words, "Quiet, come out of Him!" Jesus has the power and authority over evil, for He has conquered sin and death. He also has the power and authority over us. And when we invite Him to have that authority, He will heal us and help us persevere.

Today, we are reminded that God is in control and that we want Him to be in control. He is the loving Healer Who will work miracles in our lives if we give Him the authority to do so.
